## Plural of Nouns

## 1. Introduction:

Nouns can be used in the singular, and some of them in the plural. We will now learn to form the plural of nouns.
2. Rules for forming the plural of nouns:
2.1. We added the -S to form the plural of most nouns.

$$
\begin{gathered}
\text { apple - apples } \\
\text { desk - desks } \\
\text { shop - shops }
\end{gathered}
$$

2.2. We added -ES to form the plural of nouns ending in $-c h,-s h,-s,-x,-z$

$$
\begin{gathered}
\text { watch - watches } \\
\text { dish - dishes } \\
\text { bus - buses } \\
\text { box - boxes } \\
\text { quiz - quizes }
\end{gathered}
$$

2.3. To form the plural of nouns ending in $-Y$ :
$\checkmark \quad$ If the $-Y$ is preceded by a vowel, we add $-S$.
boy - boys
$\checkmark$ If the $-Y$ is preceded by a consonant, we eliminate the $-Y$ and add -IES.

> candy - candies
2.4. For nouns ending in -O preceded by a consonant, we add -ES.

> tomato - tomatoes
2.5. In reduced forms and in words of foreign origin ending in -O, we add -S:

$$
\begin{gathered}
\text { avocado - avocados } \\
\text { cello - cellos } \\
\text { commando - commandos }
\end{gathered}
$$

2.6. For nouns ending in -F or -FE, we remove these letters and add -VES.

$$
\begin{aligned}
& \text { Knife - knives } \\
& \text { Loaf - loaves }
\end{aligned}
$$

Not all nouns with these endings undergo this change. Gradually, you will learn how to use them properly.

There are some nouns which are called irregular:
I) They may have a different form for the plural.

$$
\begin{gathered}
\text { child - children } \\
\text { man - men } \\
\text { woman - women } \\
\text { person - people } \\
\text { foot - feet }
\end{gathered}
$$

II) They can have the same form for both the singular and the plural.

> fish - fish
> sheep - sheep
